Standard photovoltaic cable tray widths typically range from 50mm to 600mm, with common sizes including 100mm, 200mm, 300mm, and 450mm, selected based on cable quantity, type, and future expansion needs.

Standard Widths and Selection

Cable tray width is the primary factor determining cable capacity and ventilation efficiency in PV installations. Standard widths are designed to accommodate small control circuits up to large DC trunk runs in solar arrays . Typical width ranges are:

- o Light applications: 50-100mm
- o Medium duty: 200-300mm
- o Heavy industrial or large PV arrays: 450-600mm These widths are nominal inside usable dimensions, with the outside width slightly larger due to side rail thickness . Proper width selection ensures compliance with cable fill ratios, prevents overheating, and allows for future expansion.

Tray Height and Material Considerations

- o Tray heights generally range from 25mm to 150mm, depending on cable volume and ventilation requirements .
- o Material thickness affects load capacity and durability; galvanized or Magnelis(TM) steel is commonly used for outdoor PV installations, providing corrosion resistance for over 10 years in C3 environments .

Sizing Method

To select the correct tray width for a PV system:

- o Calculate total cable cross-sectional area (sum of all DC and control cables).
- o Divide by the fill ratio (typically 40% for power cables, 50% for control cables) to ensure proper ventilation .
- o Divide by desired tray height to determine the required width.
- o Add 25% spare capacity for future expansion. For example, a small residential PV system may use a 100-200mm tray, while a commercial array with multiple strings may require 300-450mm trays to accommodate higher cable volumes and maintain airflow .
